 - o Communication Channels / Website Redesign
 - Security Patrol
 - Tom Griffin (Teacher at FHS) has been hired to patrol area on Friday and Saturday nights (more nights on Holiday weekends) as well as one random night per week.
 - Tom has been employed by Seascape for years and as a result they have seen a substantial drop in unwanted activity.
 - Tom will keep in contact with Falmouth Police liaison.
 - Will speak with individuals prior to contacting Police, and will provide reports if there are any incidents.
 - Members should still call FPD if there are any issues or suspected issues.
 - Falmouth police liaison- Ryan Hergt
 - Relatively low crime rates over the Winter which is a positive for a mostly Summer community.
 - Only 1 squad car covering a very large portion of Falmouth- always call if there is a medical emergency or if underage drinking is suspected- but there may be a delay in response.
